

Clinician

We are presently seeking a full-time Licensed Practical Clinician (LPC/LCSW/LMFT) with excellent skills and experience in youth crisis intervention. As a member of our team, you will, in conjunction with our Case Managers, provide holistic, comprehensive psychotherapy, early intervention and support services to at-risk-youth, young adults and their families who may be suffering with substance use disorders and or mental health disorders. You will provide mental health assessments and counseling intervention services and will thoroughly monitor and document our clients' mental well-being. When you join our multi-disciplinary team, you will complete psychological assessments and psychological screenings using standardized psychological behavioral tools. You will also conduct individual, group, and family therapy sessions for our youth and will play a key role in leading the process to develop and implement therapeutic and aftercare plans.

What You'll Do

- Conduct intake, admission, and diagnostic assessments with clients, and document results within our case management system
- Facilitate psycho-educational and therapeutic client groups.
- Collaborate with treatment team members and clients to develop treatment plans.
- Provide weekly one-to-one counseling and crisis intervention as needed.
- Continually monitor the mental well-being of clients and arrange for appropriate services as needed.
- Provide consultation and accurate documentation regarding clients' functioning, mental health status, and treatment needs.
- Ensure the proper supervision of youth at all times.
- Participate in and comply with all meetings, assignments, process improvement, and quality improvement initiatives as assigned by supervisor
- Attend all designated organizational and industry specific training, meetings and conferences and represent the organization professionally at all times.
- Attend all departmental and program meetings to obtain awareness of policy changes, information updates, and practice modifications and ensure such updates and changes are adhered to as required.
- Accommodates clients as needed by traveling to their home-site or other convenient location to provide clinical services.
- Maintain a safe, clean and hazard-free work area.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities You Should Possess

- Master's Degree in Social Work (MSW) Counseling, Psychology or other relevant behavioral science field in which clinical training and experience is a program requirement and two years of postgraduate direct service delivery experience.
- Two years' experience conducting clinical interviews and assessments, as well as providing individual and group counseling.
- Licensed or license eligible in respective field for the state of Texas (license to include but not limited to: LPC, LMSW, and LCSW).
- Experience working with children, youth, and/or families from high-risk backgrounds.
- Must possess high tolerance for working in an emotionally demanding work environment.
- Must be able to respond to ongoing change positively and handle other essential tasks as assigned.
- Must be bilingual, able to speak English and Spanish.
- Must be able to work a flexible schedule to facilitate program services. Typically, clinicians work day shift hours; however, they must have the flexibility to work some evenings and on an occasional weekend.
- Must be able to communicate well both verbally and in writing.
- Must possess a valid state driver's license and be eligible to drive to facilitate program services as required by contractual agreements.
- Must be able to successfully pass the drug screening and successfully pass the background check from the appropriate entities.
